RING 1 Start Time 9.30am

Class 1 Small Riding Horse (15hh & under)

Horses and Ponies 4 years & over

To be judged on all round ability as a riding horse

SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 2 Large Riding Horse (Over 15hh)

Horses 4 years & over, to be judged on all round ability as a riding horse

SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 3 Ridden Pairs (Entries taken on the day)

Any combination of horse or pony 4 years & over may compete.

Pairs will be required to give a show

SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 4 Side Saddle

Horses and ponies 4 years & over, to be judged on all round ability as a riding horse. Will be required to give an individual show

SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

RING 1 GYMKHANA Start Time 2.30pm (Entries taken on the day)

Class 5 Gymkhana Races (all 5 races count as one class)

Heats will be run prior to the final of each race dependant on entries at the discretion of the stewards. No whips or spurs allowed.

Horses and ponies 4 years & over

SEAHG special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under in each final

a) **Bending Race**

b) **Walk – Trot – Canter**

Competitors are required to turn a circle if they break stride as instructed by the stewards.

c) **Stepping Stones**

Competitors are required to ride to the steps, dismount balance across the stones remount and ride to the finish. Competitors must return to the start of the stepping stones if they put a foot to the ground.

d) **Flag Race**

Any flag dropped must be retrieved. Flags must be placed properly into the holders

e) **Apple Bobbing**

Only the human is allowed to retrieve the apple from the bowl!
Then remount and ride to the finish with the apple

RING 2 SHOW JUMPING

Show Jumping classes to run under current BSJA Rules

Competitors must declare with the ring steward 15 minutes before the start of their class Course available to walk for Class 6 at 9.00am

Class 6 Novice Jumping (Jumps approx 0.70m to 0.75m)
Horses & ponies 4 years & over
Horse/pony & rider must not have won a novice jumping class in 2009/10
Judged over one round, second round against the clock
SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 7 Open Jumping (Jumps approx 0.75m to 0.85m)
Horses & ponies 4 years & over
Judged over one round, second round against the clock
SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 8 Top Score
Horses & ponies 4 years & over
Jumps ranging between 0.70m and 0.75m with a Joker at 0.85m
Knocking down the joker will result in that score being deducted from your total score.

RING 2 WORKING HUNTER

2.00pm (Entries taken on the day class size permitting)

Working Hunter Classes -Competitors must declare with the ring steward 15 minutes before the start of their class.

Course available to walk for Class 9 at 1.30pm

Class 9 Novice Working Hunter (Jumps approx 0.70)
Horses & ponies 4 years & over.
Horse/pony & rider as a pair must not have won a novice working hunter class in 2009/2010.
SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 10 Open Working Hunter (Jumps approx 0.75)
For horses & ponies 4 years & over
SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Class 14 Western Pleasure

Horses & ponies 4 years and over

This class will be judged on the performance, condition and confirmation of the horse or pony. 20% of the judging will be based on condition and performance. Entries will be penalised for excessive speed or wrong leads

Class 15 Western Horsemanship

Horses & ponies 4 years & over

Riders are judged on seat, hands, ability to control and show the horse. Results achieved by the performance of the horse or pony are not considered more important than the method used by the rider.

Class 16 Western Riding

Horses & ponies 4 years & over

Competitors are required to ride one of three patterns set out in the Society rule book. The horse will be judged on quality of gaits, changes of lead, response to the rider, manners, disposition and intelligence.

Class 17 NOVICE HUNTER TRIAL

(Late entries taken on the day class size permitting)

Fences 0.75meters maximum height

To be run under British Eventing Rules see www.britisheventing.co.uk

Horses & ponies 4 years & over

SEAHG Special Rosette to highest placed Junior Rider 16 yrs & under

Body protectors are compulsory and correct headwear must be worn by all competitors.

The course will be available for walking before the start of the class, please allow time as the class will start at 10.00am

Please register with the starting steward BEFORE 10.00am which is the start of the class. The hunter trial will be run against the clock

Penalties

- Knock down = 4
- First refusal disobedience = 4
- Second refusal/disobedience = 8
- Third refusal/disobedience = Elimination
- Fall of rider = Elimination
- Fall of horse or pony = Elimination
- Error of course = Elimination
- All Rules as per BSJA

Class 18 COMBINED TRAINING TO INCLUDE (3 Disciplines)

1. Hunter Trial – Class 17
2. Dressage - Either class 11, 12 or 13 to be nominated on your Entry Form
3. Show Jumping- Either Class 6 or 7 only to be nominated on your Entry Form

NOTICE TO ALL COMPETITORS

1. All junior riders 16 years and under to wear a **RED ARMBAND** on the near side to qualify for the highest placed junior rosette presented every class.

REGIONAL GROUPS TEAM COMPETITION

1. Nominated members of Regional Group Teams must wear a coloured armband. Colours will be allocated upon nomination of Team/s by each Team Manager who will have submitted a Regional Group Team Nomination Form, available to download on web site www.seahg.co.uk
2. Up to 4 members in a team and up to 2 teams may compete for each Regional Group
3. Team riders must be member of their Regional Group and named with one horse on the Regional Group Team Nomination Form,
4. Points will be award to Team Members gaining a place in each class. 1st place earns 6 points, 2nd place earns 5 points and so on. The winning team and placings will be decided by the highest number of points gained.

- 1) This show is NOT affiliated to The Arab Horse Society but will be subject to the current Show Rules and Regulations of the Arab Horse Society.
- 2) Objections must be made in writing and submitted to the Show Secretary within one hour of the end of the class or the occurrence and accompanied by the a deposit of £50.00 (fifty pounds).
- 3) All exhibits must be registered with the AHS in the appropriate section by the closing date of entries. **A PHOTOCOPY OF THE AHS REGISTRATION DOCUMENT SHOWING ALL CURRENT DETAILS MUST BE ENCLOSED WITH ALL ENTRY FORMS.**
- 4) No late entries, alterations or substitutions will be permitted after the closing date for entries unless specified in the schedule.
- 5) The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 6) The Show Committee may at their discretion, cancel, split or amalgamate any class/es.
- 7) In the event of their being three or less entries in a class, the first prize only will be awarded. For classes with four to six entries, only first and second prizes will be awarded. The Show Committee reserves the right to waive this restriction or to award additional prizes and/or rosettes.
- 8) No entry fees will be refunded unless a class is cancelled or on production of a valid Veterinary Certificate.
- 9) The judge's decision in all cases will be final. He/she may withhold any award if there is not sufficient merit.
- 10) The Show Committee reserves the right to arrange for replacement or substitute judge if necessary.
- 11) All communication by any exhibitor to a judge must be via the appropriate steward.
- 12) No horse or rider may leave the ring without first obtaining the permission of the judge. Care has been taken over the timing of classes but in the event that competitors find that he/she should be in two rings at the same time, then the competitor must choose in which class he/she prefers to compete.
- 13) Any horse behaving in a dangerous manner may be asked to leave the showground.
- 14) No claim for anything that may happen to onlookers, exhibitors, owners, agents, their servants, horses or property, in connection with, or arising out of this show, or conduct or management thereof, will be recognised. Further, exhibitors must indemnify the Show Committee against all actions, costs, claims, demands or liability arising out of any action in which he or she may be concerned.
- 15) In the interest of safety, horses are not allowed into the separate pedestrian areas.
- 16) No person shall be mounted on the showground unless he/she is wearing a correctly fitting hard hat.
- 17) Unattended horses and ponies must not be left tied to the outside of any vehicle.
- 18) Anyone noticing an incident of neglect or ill treatment must report this to the Show Secretary immediately.
- 19) Cars will not be permitted to park in the pedestrian area except in special circumstances and by prior arrangement.
- 20) All dogs on the showground must be kept under control on a lead at all times and should not be left in cars in hot weather.
- 21) All exhibits in any ridden classes must be age four years and over.
- 22) In the event of the Show having to be cancelled The South East Arabian Horse Group reserve the right to withhold 50% of entry fees paid to cover expenses.
- 23) Any competitor's cheques for entry fees etc. that fails to clear when presented at their bank will be required to pay all outstanding Monies and any incurred charges before being allowed to compete. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse future show entries from that competitor.
- 24) Class times will only be given for the first class of the morning and afternoon sessions. Competitors are strongly advised to arrive early and watch the progression of classes for themselves. Exhibitors are responsible for being on time for their classes.
- 25) Competitors should collect their numbers from the Show Secretary on the day of the show.
- 26) Any person or persons on the showground behaving in a rude, abusive or dangerous manner likely to compromise the health and safety and the enjoyment of anyone attending the show may be asked to leave the showground.
- 27) Any person or persons who are on the showground for any reason whatsoever, either before, during or after the show is deemed to have agreed to abide by the Southern Arabian Performance Show Rules and Conditions 2010.

How to find the Showground

Pachesham Equestrian Centre, Randalls Road, Leatherhead, Surrey KT22 0AL

Pachesham is situated on the A245 nearly 1 mile from Leatherhead railway station, in the direction of Cobham, on the right hand side.

From the A24 go into Leatherhead and follow the one-way system. Turn left in front of the railway station towards Cobham.

From the M25 J9 follow Esher signs (A244). Turn left at the roundabout into Oaklawn Road, sign posted 'Crematorium, Golf Centre'. Turn left at the end onto the A245. We are first on the left.

From the A3 leave at 'Esher Common' junction (A244). Take the A244 towards Leatherhead. Go approximately 2 miles through Oxshott. At the roundabout turn right into Oaklawn Road (see paragraph above for directions from the M25 J9).
